1 Ponemah Beach Central

Always a community hub! First, as a general store, built around 1930, and now as a vibrant community centre for social and sustainability activities.

2 Dunnottar Station Museum

Housed in the original Ponemah CPR station, the Dunnottar Station Museum is a treasure trove of local history and nostalgia maintained by dedicated volunteers. Come take a step back to the time of railway travel. Celebrating 20 years in 2026!

3 Nelson Pier

Not one of the original locations, the pier at Nelson became part of a growing family of these unique "bridges" as lake levels changed and desire grew. Considered a "place marker" for the village, the piers have been constructed each spring and taken down each fall for decades- a cherished Dunnottar tradition!



Dunnottar Point/Dunnottar Yacht Club

Constructed in 1909 by Alex Melville, the Yacht Club was short-lived and the demise of the building unclear. However, the house at the Point is a wonderful reminder of those summer days.



“Dunnottar’s Little Green Space”

The Village donated this 0.73 hectare oasis for migrating and resident birds. Approaching its 20th year, this small yet mighty space is a reminder of the importance of citizen advocacy and habitat conservation in the Lake Winnipeg watershed.



Community Gardens

An example of a “rethink”! The land for the community gardens was once home to several native species, including yellow lady’s slipper. In a bid to make the land more attractive for development, the area was cleared and razed. After many years of dormancy, it was revitalized in the form of community gardens, which are supported by the Village and volunteers from Age Friendly Dunnottar.
